Margaret Ann Evans Farrow (Peggy), 77, went to be with her heavenly father on Tuesday June 11, 2024. She passed peacefully at her home in Washington, DC with her children by her side.

Peggy was born on September 11, 1946 in Graham, NC to James Vincent Evans and Margarett Pearl Ellison Evans. 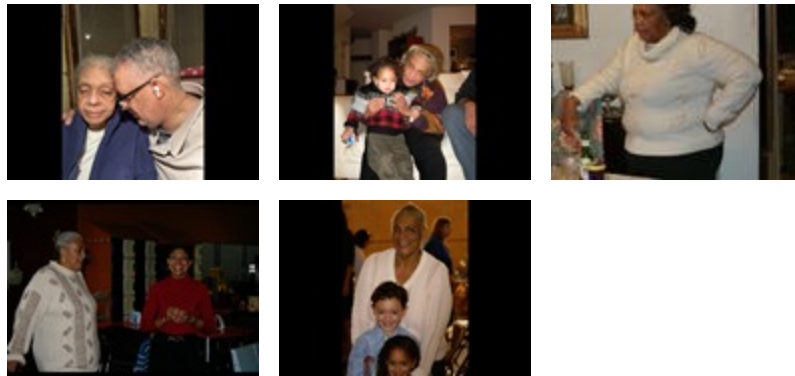
