April 18, 1982 - March 29, 2024

Thomas Andrew Kinsell, 41, of Arlington, VA passed away peacefully surrounded by his mother, sister San and best friend Jon. He was born April 18, 1982 in Springfield, IL, the son of Jack and Pam.

He is survived by his parents: Pam (Jim) Wells of Springfield, IL and Lugene Kinsell of Jacksonville, IL. A few of Thomas' greatest adventures as an adult include joining the Peace Corps. He served two years in Moldova where he taught English and Health to children. While in Moldova, he was joined by his father Jack and Favorite Sister San for three weeks for a Kinsell Family Reunion. The three of them traveled around Moldova, Turkey and Romania having the adventure of a

lifetime. He later entered the Federal Government workforce and lived in several locations. One of his favorites was the three years he resided in Puerto Rico. He was very fluent in Spanish and loved living near the beach. Thomas also enjoyed vacations to Colombia with his friends and hiking. His most recent adventure included a family vacation in Hawaii. Thomas had a love for adventure, hiking, chicken nuggets, Smoothie King and the Kinsell family drink, a rum and coke.

Cremation rites have been accorded. A private celebration of life will be held at a later date.

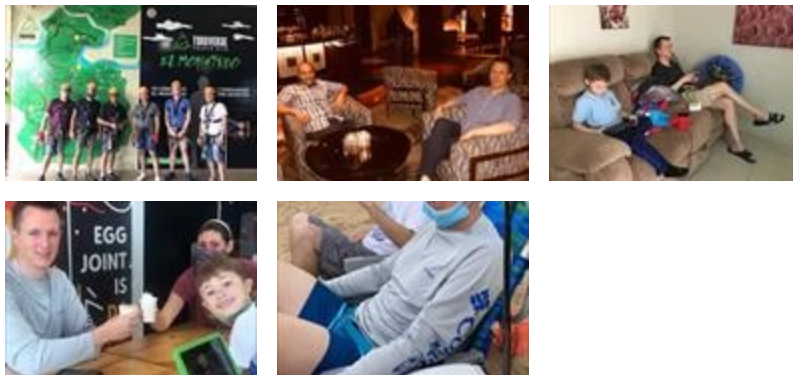
